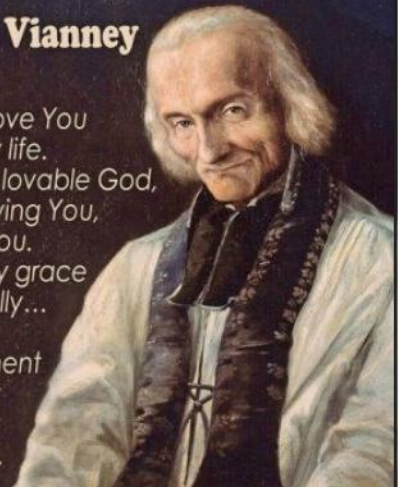

Prayer of St. John Vianney

I love You, O my God, and my only desire is to love You until the last breath of my life. I love You, O my infinitely lovable God, and I would rather die loving You, than live without loving You. I love You, Lord & the only grace I ask is to love You eternally... My God, if my tongue cannot say in every moment that I love You, I want my heart to repeat it to You as often as I draw breath.



MIRACULOUS TRANSFORMATION



After the miraculous multiplication of loaves and fish, where Jesus fed more than 5,000 people and filled twelve wicker baskets with the leftovers from five loaves of bread and two fish, He revealed its profound meaning. This miracle was not just about physical nourishment but a symbolic act foreshadowing the Eucharist. By sharing His Body and Blood, Jesus demonstrated His divine authority and prepared His disciples for the sacrament that would become the cornerstone of Christian worship.

For John the Evangelist, this miracle was a signpost, a precursor to the Eucharist that would come later. Just as the Last Supper occurred before the Jewish feast of Passover, this miracle was a foreshadowing of the eternal banquet to come, a moment of profound anticipation.

In many important ways, John's Gospel uses the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes to teach about the Eucharist. Like the Last Supper, this miracle is said to have occurred near the time of the Jewish feast of Passover. (In John's Gospel, three Passovers are identified.) Jesus' language is similar to the language he used at the Last Supper, as reported in the Synoptic Gospels. John's description of this event also anticipates the Messianic banquet of heaven as the crowd reclines and all hunger is satisfied. This connection is further amplified by the response of the crowd, who wants to make Jesus a king. John is teaching us that each time we celebrate the Eucharist, we anticipate heaven's eternal banquet. This profound sense of unity and community in celebrating the Eucharist is a powerful reminder of our shared faith and the anticipation of our eternal banquet in heaven.

During the Offertory in the Mass, we, like the boy in the Gospel of John, bring the gifts of bread and wine that we have received from the love and bounty of God. These gifts, transformed by our hands, are presented with our prayer of supplication or thanksgiving. In a divine miracle, God receives our offering and further transforms the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. This sacred food, returned to us, is consumed on our journey, granting us everlasting life. This transformative power of the Eucharist, known as transubstantiation, is a profound mystery of our faith, where the substance of the bread and wine is changed into the substance of Christ's Body and Blood. In contrast, the appearance of bread and wine remains. This profound transformation is a testament to our faith's depth and the Eucharist's miracle.

VOTE NO! AMENDMENT 4



Vote No on Amendment 4: An extremely grave amendment has been placed on the November 2024 ballot that seeks to erase pro-life protections by inserting language into the Florida Constitution banning regulation of abortion. This

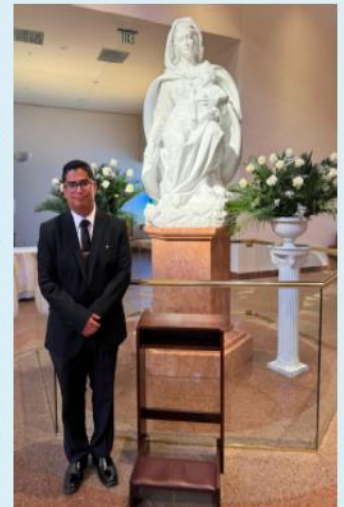


The Paris Olympics 2024 started July 26.

SAINT OF THE WEEK: JOHN VIANNEY



A man with vision overcomes obstacles and performs deeds that seem impossible. John Vianney was a man with a vision: He wanted to become a priest. But he had to overcome his meager formal schooling, which inadequately prepared him for seminary studies.

His failure to comprehend Latin lectures forced him to discontinue. But his vision of being a priest urged him to seek private tutoring. After a lengthy battle with the books, John was ordained.

Situations calling for “impossible” deeds followed him everywhere. As pastor of the parish at Ars, John encountered people who were indifferent and quite comfortable with their style of living. His vision led him through severe fasts and short nights of sleep.

With Catherine Lassagne and Benedicta Lardet, he established La Providence, a home for girls. Only a man of vision could have such trust that God would provide for the spiritual and material needs of all those who came to make La Providence their home.

His work as a confessor is John Vianney’s most remarkable accomplishment. He was to spend 11 to 12 hours daily reconciling people with God in the winter months. In the summer months, this time was increased to 16 hours. Unless a man was dedicated to his vision of a priestly vocation, he could not have endured this giving of self day after day.

Many people look forward to retirement and taking it easy, doing the things they always wanted to do but never had the time. But John Vianney had no thoughts of retirement. As his fame spread, more hours were consumed in serving God’s people. Even the few hours he would allow himself to sleep were frequently disturbed by the devil.

Who but a man with vision could keep going with ever-increasing strength? In 1929, Pope Pius XI named him the patron of parish priests worldwide.

Reflection: Indifference toward religion and a love for material comfort seem to be common signs of our times. A person from another planet observing us would not likely judge us as pilgrims on our way elsewhere. On the other hand, John Vianney was a man on a journey, with his goal before him at all times.

EUCCHARISTIC REVIVAL PILGRIMAGE



A Eucharistic pilgrimage from Indianapolis to Los Angeles is being planned for Spring 2025, according to Bishop Andrew H. Cozzens of Crookston, Minnesota. His announcement was made July 21 at the end of the 10th National Eucharistic Congress’ closing Mass.

Congress organizers also considered holding an 11th National Eucharistic Congress in 2033, the “Year of Redemption,” 2,000 years after Jesus’ death and resurrection. But they’re now discerning organizing an event sooner, said Bishop Cozzens, board chairman of the National Eucharistic Congress, Inc., which organized the five-day congress and preceding eight-week Eucharistic pilgrimage.

Few logistics for next year’s pilgrimage have been determined. The route will likely travel through the American Southwest, culminating in a Corpus Christi Mass in Los Angeles with Archbishop José H. Gomez of Los Angeles.

With more than four million Catholics, Los Angeles is home to the nation’s largest Catholic population.

“We decided that we want to keep this tradition of a national Eucharistic pilgrimage going, and we’re going to do one next year,” Bishop Cozzens said. “The goal is basically to continue the renewal that’s begun through these Eucharistic pilgrimages.”

As for the timing of the next Eucharistic congress, Bishop Cozzens said congress organizers have been inspired by “all the people at the congress saying that we have to do this again, and when we were telling people we’re going to do it in 2033, they would say it’s too late, we might lose momentum in nine years.”

He noted that that sentiment came from congress benefactors and people involved since the beginning. “Maybe it should be something like the Olympics every four years,” he said. “I think the impact certainly grew more than any of us expected. And so, since it’s been so impactful, we’re going to discern what will serve the church as we go forward.”

From May 17-18, Pentecost weekend, 30 young adults, “perpetual pilgrims,” traveled with the Eucharist along four routes, beginning in California, Connecticut, Minnesota, and Texas.

Collectively, they traveled through 27 states and 65 dioceses, covering a combined distance of 6,500 miles—many of them on foot—with the help of support vehicles. Their pilgrimage included daily stops at parishes, shrines, and Catholic institutions for Mass, Eucharistic processions, and adoration while experiencing the array of Catholicism in America along the way.

The pilgrims converged in downtown Indianapolis on July 16, ahead of the National Eucharistic Congress, at St. John the Evangelist, a historic Catholic church immediately across from the main entrance of the Indiana Convention Center. Speaking with OSV News, pilgrims described the experience as personally life-changing and described seeing its profound effects on many people who encountered the Eucharist through it.

The pilgrimage and congress are part of the National Eucharistic Revival, a three-year initiative of the U.S. bishops launched in 2022 to increase understanding of and love for Jesus in the Eucharist. The close of the congress launched the Year of Mission, during which the bishops encouraged Catholics to “walk with one” by sharing their faith and accompanying another person to better know Jesus and his love.

TRANSFORMACIÓN MILAGROSA



Después de la milagrosa multiplicación de los panes y los peces, donde Jesús alimentó a más de 5.000 personas y llenó doce cestas de mimbre con los restos de cinco panes y dos peces, reveló su profundo significado. Este milagro no se trataba sólo de alimento físico sino de un acto simbólico que presagiaba la Eucaristía. Al compartir Su Cuerpo y Sangre, Jesús demostró Su autoridad divina y preparó a Sus discípulos para el sacramento que se convertiría en la piedra angular del culto cristiano.

Para Juan Evangelista, este milagro fue una señal, un precursor de la Eucaristía que vendría después. Así como la Última Cena ocurrió antes de la fiesta judía de la Pascua, este milagro fue un presagio del banquete eterno por venir, un momento de profunda anticipación.

De muchas maneras importantes, el Evangelio de Juan utiliza el milagro de la multiplicación de los panes y los peces para enseñar acerca de la Eucaristía. Al igual que la Última Cena, se dice que este milagro ocurrió cerca del tiempo de la fiesta judía de la Pascua. (En el Evangelio de Juan se identifican tres Pascuas). El lenguaje de Jesús es similar al lenguaje que usó en la Última Cena, como se informa en los Evangelios sinópticos. La descripción que hace Juan de este evento también anticipa el banquete mesiánico del cielo cuando la multitud se reclina y todo el hambre queda satisfecha. Esta conexión se ve amplificada aún más por la respuesta de la multitud, que quiere hacer de Jesús rey. Juan nos está enseñando que cada vez que celebramos la Eucaristía, anticipamos el banquete eterno del cielo. Este profundo sentido de unidad y comunidad al celebrar la Eucaristía es un poderoso recordatorio de nuestra fe compartida y la anticipación de nuestro banquete eterno en el cielo.

Durante el Ofertorio en la Misa, nosotros, como el niño del Evangelio de Juan, traemos los dones de pan y vino que hemos recibido del amor y la generosidad de Dios. Estos dones, transformados por nuestras manos, se presentan con nuestra oración de súplica o acción de gracias. En un milagro divino, Dios recibe nuestra ofrenda y transforma aún más el pan y el vino en el Cuerpo y Sangre de nuestro Señor Jesucristo. Este alimento sagrado, devuelto a nosotros, se consume en nuestro viaje, otorgándonos vida eterna. Este poder transformador de la Eucaristía, conocido como transustanciación, es un misterio profundo de nuestra fe, donde la sustancia del pan y del vino se transforma en la sustancia del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. En cambio, permanece la apariencia del pan y del vino. Esta profunda transformación es un testimonio de la profundidad de nuestra fe y del milagro de la Eucaristía.

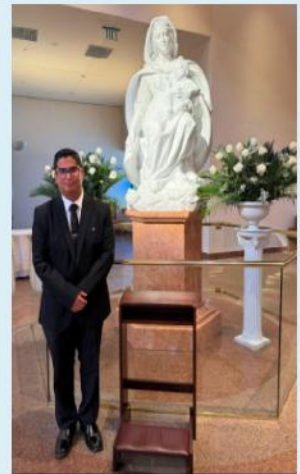
